Last week I was invited to speak at a

business focused summit sponsored by the Westside Economic Alliance to unveil their strategic plan for economic development. I was pleased that a Community Action perspective was valued and included. I noted in their report the following comment; "The greatest threat to our economic success and our livability is that the Westside will be divided into a region of have and have-nots, between those able to fend for themselves in a knowledge economy and those who are left behaind. We can't allow any of our citizens to be left behind. The costs in terms of economic haredship, a loss in our shared quality of life and the cost of public service would be far to high." It was a welcome opener for me to provide them with information on the current state of poverty and economic insecurity in our county. Did you realize that while the total county population increased 43% in the last decade, that those living in poverty increased 74%? Or that our minority population increased from 10% to 25% of the total population? Or, that an affordable housing wage for Washington County is \$15.29 an hour and that 39% of renters in Washington County cannot afford a 2 bedroom unit at market rate? It has become painfully clear that the cost of living has risen beyond the means of entry level pay and that strategies to close this gap are clearly needed. Stay tuned.....

#### 2-1-1/I&R Q&A Series:

"Why 2-1-1?"

Finding help is incredibly difficult especially wnen one is seeking basic services such as shelter, food, prescription assistance, etc. In addition to lacking a clear number to call, it is also challenging to know how to navigate the maze of social services. 2-1-1 simplifies this process by providing access to I&R via an easy to remember three-digit number.

**Opening Doors:** 

Washington County residents may be eligible to receive a Cosco Turiva convertible carseat at cost (\$25.00). Income qualification is based on WIC income guidelines. Opening Doors will only accept money orders payable to **ACTS Oregon**. Some booster seats may also be available. For more information call 971-223-6006.

#### RECIPE: Impossible Quesadilla Pie

2 – 4 oz. Cans chopped green chilies, drained 4 Cup shredded cheddar cheese (about 16 oz.)

2 Cup Milk

1 Cup biscuit baking mix

4 eggs

Heat oven to 425 degrees. Grease 10"X1½" pie plate. Sprinkle chilies and cheese into plate; beat milk, baking mix & eggs until smooth (15 seconds in blender on high, or 1 min. by hand). Pour into plate. Bake until knife inserted into center comes out clear -15 to 30 min. Let stand 10 min. before cutting.

#### Topics - An ATTITUDE of GRATITUDE- part II

Excerpts from article by Charlie Wanzek Michaels

WHY WE AREN'T THANKFUL I believe we aren't thankful because we expect what we have been given. Even the poorest of our poor have more food and possessions than the average citizen of the world. For us, abundance is normal and expected.

My parents tried to show me what life was like for people who were less fortunate... to make me more appreciative of what I had. Instead, it made me afraid of poor people. My sense of entitle- ment was so strong, I couldn't see "except for the grace of God" my family might live there.

My high school also tried to show me all I had to be thankful for by arranging an exchange with an inner city school. I was shocked. But rather than feeling grateful for what I had, I was indignant that others didn't have as much as I felt they should.

My parents taught me to say "please" and "thank you," write thank you notes, respect public property... but rather than feel grateful, I felt I was a dutiful good girl. I had to witness gratitude to realize I had not been appreciative as I'd gone through the motions of being thankful.

I've seen lots of poverty by US standards. Despite ongoing indignation over others' plights, I was never appreciative of what we have until I traveled in Southeast Asia. Everywhere there were people who had nothing, yet were so much more content. They felt blessed. They lived joyously. They knew gratitude. To be continued in next issue.

# Benefits, Diversity Policy and so forth



It is nearing the end of the year and no one seems to know where all the time went! However, at this time of the year, some of you schedule time to review your retirement options and make appropriate changes. For employees who have enrolled in our 403(b) plan, or wish to do so, here is some important information:

If currently enrolled and you wish to make funding changes, you may contact Lincoln through our representative, Julie McDevitt at 503-699-4164. She will assist you with the process to change investment strategy. If enrolled, and you simply want to increase or decrease the amount of your pretax contribution (from your paycheck), you should contact HR and we will send you the form to do this.

If you are not enrolled in the 403(b) Plan, but wish to do so, you may contact Julie McDevitt at 503-699-4164 and make an appt. to meet with her and complete the application process. First ask HR to send you a packet of 403(b) information so that you have it when you meet with Julie.

HOLIDAYS – We are closed for Thanksgiving & the Friday after EXCEPT for Early Head Start, Full Day Full Year program & the Shelter. The Agency will close all programs (except for the Shelter) for Christmas Day and New Years Day. For all other days during that time we will be open for business.

someone is injured.


