Meal Time: Keep It Simple. Keep It Fun. Just Keep It! April 22, 1999, 7-9 pm.



Golden Egg Baskets


1 Pkg. Refrigerated biscuit dough 1 Egg per serving Grated Cheese (your choice)

Place refrigerator biscuit dough in a muffin tin, pressing it into the sides and bottom to make a well. Pour 1 egg into each basket. When all the baskets have been completed, bake for 10 to 15 minutes at 400°. Sprinkle with cheese. Serve when cheese has melted. Each basket is 1 serving.

Green Grass Mini Village

What you need:

- Drainage saucer for 10" flower pot
- Fresh potting soil
- Wheat berries or rye grass seed
- Clear plastic wrap
- Miniature items (toys, figures, animals eggs, etc. Plastic cake decorations work well!)

Kids can design their own village while nature takes care of the plant life!

Fill saucer with soil. Sprinkle seeds over entire surface. Use plastic spray bottle filled with water and lightly spray until soil is damp but not soggy. Cover with plastic to retain moisture. (Remove if mold develops.) Place in indirect sunlight, and keep soil moist until seeds germinate (about 4-5 days).

After seeds have germinated, remove plastic wrap and place tray near a sunny window. Your children will be amazed to see how rapidly the green sprouts will grow. Create a village setting by placing miniature items in the grass. Use twigs for trees and bright tissue paper bits for flowers. Pathways can be added to the village by clipping the grass however you wish. Add miniature bunnies and eggs as Easter approaches.
