# HR (Benefits/Diversity/Q&A) Ask Winnie


June is our traditional OPEN ENROLLMENT month when you can change plans, add dependents and the like. We've held 3 meetings this month to inform you of changes that will take effect on July 1<sup>st</sup> and those coming on October 1<sup>st</sup>. If you missed the meetings last week, your next chance is in September when we will have a 2<sup>nd</sup> Open Enrollment.

This year the COLA increase effective on July 1, 2002 will be 3%. Just a reminder that everyone will receive this increase, except those who are on a performance probation and those who are still in the 90-day New Hire Introductory period. It will appear in your check on 7-12-02. When you successfully complete the new hire introductory period or the performance probation period, you will receive the 3% COLA.

As you know, for several years now our hiring range has been between 60% & 80% of the market, and this year we are moving the hiring range to 70% & 85% of market. This is the first step in moving our pay to market. We are working on additional tools that will help move individual pay up to market as well.
