Transitional Housing Alumni:

Families who have successfully completed their stay in Washington County transitional housing programs.

Families working with Community Action Organization staff: Families who have developed an ongoing relationship with CAO through our Head Start early education preschool program or our SAFAH program for formerly homeless families.

Tenant Education Graduates:

Program participants attend four 21/2 hour classes. The program emphasizes self-sufficiency, open communication, self-advocacy, and personal responsibility. Classes provide information on how to find and maintain stable housing; fair housing and landlord-tenant law, apartment upkeep, budgeting & credit issues, household safety, accessing local resources, and goal planning.


