March 6, 1950

APRIL 3, 1950

Meeting was called to order by the President.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Treasurer's report was accepted. Taken in \$1.00; Paid Out; \$60.00 Stand \$7.00 Cub Scouts; \$45.00 Dooher/ Balance \$257.39.

The president read a letter explaining three plans submitted for the Clubs consideration on finishing the tennis court by Bill Mann.

Henry Hering moved that Bill Mann proceed with plan #1. Seconded and carried.

Curtains for the Gymn stage was discussed.

He said two new Den Mothers have been added here in Cornelius. The Cubs are making plans for a "Country Fair" and he hoped a good turnout would be expected.

Monty Benson reported on the building of the stand. It was agreed that Henry Hering and Gene Hillis would paint it.

Motion made by Jim Harleman to hold the July meeting on Monday July 10. Motion seconded by Gene Hillis--carried.

The topic of a "Picnic" is to be discussed at the next meeting. There being no further business--meeting adjourned.
