During the month of September we will be holding Benefit Open Enrollment Meetings. We will be changing insurance companies for health & dental. We've listened to your voice regarding the Kaiser dental plan and have found a carrier that will reduce our costs by 7% (YEP you read it correctly!) and allow you to see a dentist of your choice. As you've been hearing in the national & local news, the costs of health insurance have continued to rise at double digit percentages. We are fortunate to have a regional expert in health insurance on our Board Personnel Committee, Geoff Brown. He and our Agent, Roger Gahlsdorf put their heads together and we solicited quotes from 5 companies (including Kaiser & Pacificare). Rates ranged from 12% increase to 64% increase - GULP! We put on our thinking caps & asked Kaiser to quote us a Dual Choice Plan. The result is that those employees who wish to stay with their doctor may do so (if he/she is on the PPO list), and, those who want to use the Kaiser HMO (current coverage) through this Kaiser Plan can do so. We believe that those employees on Pacificare will be paying about the same for the new plan premium as they are for the current Pacificare plan = little to no increase for you. The Open Enrollment dates have not been confirmed, but I expect to post notices within the next week - so watch for that info & come to a meeting.

SAFETY

At the August meeting the committee received a draft of a communicable disease policy for employees (those of you in Child Development, do not confuse with the Head Start policy for children). The committee will be taking it back to their work areas to elicit comments and at the October meeting we will go over them.

In the fall, the main office will be updated with automatic doors for the physically challenged; in the past few years new technology will make it less expensive than perceived & Washington Co. is also helping us out.

The window in the South end of the main bldg. has been "frosted" with paint to avoid being blinded by the sun & falling down the stairs.
