
Congrats! Mary Jo Panaggio on your promotion to TIII.

Tips

Put Melon on the Menu - Up your intake of hearthealthy lycopene this week by serving red watermelon.

The red variety of watermelon is one of the few foods that contains high amounts of lycopene, a nutrient that is not only important to prostate health, but which also may improve heart health, studies suggest. Lycopene is a red pigment, so choose red watermelon rather than yellow varieties.

Recipe: THAI SHRIMP ON BABY GREENS

1/2 c fresh lime juice

1/2 t salt

1 LB fresh Oregon baby shrimp

1 cucumber sliced

1/2 c finely chopped onion (Walla Walla are best)

1 red pepper sliced

1/2 c fresh sliced mushrooms

3 T chopped dry roasted peanuts

1/2 c light reduced fat coconut milk (canned)

1/2 nonfat yogurt

1/4 c fresh cilantro

3 c baby salad greens (whatever salad mix you like, I think it's best with spinach)

CHILD DEVELOPMENT

A Kids Domain will be starting back again on Wednesday, September 3. We have a new site this year – AKD Fern Hill at Fern Hill Elementary school. This is a brand new facility and we are excited to be there! The other AKD sites are at Cornelius, Echo Shaw and Harvey Clarke. As a result of boundary changes, some children who were attending AKD at Harvey Clarke were moved to Dilley Elementary school. Thanks to the Forest Grove Superintendent, Jack Musser who elected to alter bus routes in order to provide pick-up and drop-off services at Harvey Clarke Elementary School for youngsters who were moved to Dilley school and needed childcare services. This is a oneyear transitional provision for the 2003-2004 school year only.

Head Start Full Day Full Year programs are scheduled to begin on Tuesday, September 2. There is a new addition to our center based Full Day Full Year sites – Tigard Child Development Center. The other sites are Hillsboro and Beaverton Child Development Centers. The new Part-Day Early Head Start classrooms in Hillsboro and Beaverton CDCs are sccheduled to provide services to 16 children 0-3 years old as of September 22.

Benefits, Diversity...

September is Open Enrollment month and we

have scheduled meetings on various days and times so that all of you can make one of them. A number of folks have asked me if they need to attend....YES, EVERYONE needs to ATTEND one of the meetings. One reason is that Pacificare will no longer be one of the choices. We are going with the current Kaiser HMO for one plan, and a Kaiser CHOICE PLAN for the 2nd option. This way staff that wish to keep a certain doctor will have an opportunity to do so. A 2nd reason why we ask all staff to attend (if eligible for benefits & that is everyone who is scheduled to work 20+ hrs./week) is to get current enrollment info for everyone. Years ago when some of you originally signed up for coverage your file copy was filed with the biweekly payroll record and is not in your employee file. And, you can see how that would be a problem. So we need current info. Why are we changing? We were quoted premium increases ranging from 18.5% up to 65%. The change to Kaiser reflects a 12% increase.

All Child Development staff need to attend one of the scheduled meetings.

In response to concerns raised in the 12/01 Employee Survey, we are are changing our dental coverage from Kaiser to Met Life. This will allow staff to choose any dentist (except Kaiser dentists). The change will result in a 7% DECREASE in premiums.

Some of you will applaud these changes and some of you will not. We continue to try to balance good benefit coverage with the ability to sustain the costs that go with good coverage. Not always easy.

If you are covered by Pacificare and in the middle of serious medical treatment you may want to speak to our Agent at the meeting to determine best
