"PROJECT 40" marks the 40th anniversary of the mobilization of the National Guard on September 16, 1940. On that date, President Roosevelt ordered the call-up to Federal service of the National Guard in order to build up the Regular Army prior to World War II. Oregon Guardsmen of the 41st Infantry Division and the 249th Coast Artillery were called on that first day of the largest military mobilization in United States history. Eventually, more than 300,000 National Guardsmen were called.

Today, in commemorating that event, we call attention to the patriotic service of those National Guardsmen who fought in World War II, and in all of the armed conflicts in our nation's history.

We also honor the men and women of today's Oregon

National Guard who, by their own dedicated service, stand
ready to serve in any future conflict.
