
If the Republican Party ever had an opportunity to show that it is THE PARTY OF THE OPEN DOOR—as the President, himself, has proclaimed it—now is that time.

















Our Man In Miami... Penn Senator Hugh Scott

'Scotticisms...'

In 31-plus years since he took his seat as a freshman in the 77th Congress, the recorded words of Philadelphia's erudite scholar, untiring statesman and the insouciant slayer of demogogues has given him an honored place in old Foggy's Hall of Oratorical Fame.

Hugh does not swash at his opponents with the ponderous cutlass of old-time forensics—rather, he pierces them with the rakish thrust of rapier repartee.

Although the pleasant-mannered Minority Leader is capable of deep anger over official foibles that foil the American people, it is his biting sarcasm on such occasions that betrays the true depth of Scott's scorn for the nefarious.

Piquant Prose of the Pennsylvania Poker

Constitutional Proposals

To act at a time when there is great emotional stress does not necessarily contribute to good legislation . . . there should be a dialogue.

War Critics

I am sick and tired of seeing this war used as a political football by many of the same fellows who in previous years lauded our involvement in Vietnam. It is our intention to make sure everyone within hearing distance knows that the thrust of this Administration commitment is to down the war and up the economy.

Equal Time

The President took about 30 minutes to deliver his State of the Union address. All the networks gave 55 minutes to his opponents. I can only suggest they need it.

Absenteeism

There is no time for skiing in Switzerland when the Senate is in session, unless the constituency has given approval. And if that is the case, it should pay for the skiers.

Equal Employment

It is my great honor...

Mr. Chairman, members of this great Republican Convention, fellow Americans:

Four years ago, when we met here in Miami, America was torn by violence at home, America was in deep trouble abroad, inflation was eating away at the hard-earned wages and lifetime savings of those who have built America.

There were riots in our cities, there was chaos on our campuses. Grim, escalating war was claiming the lives of thousands of our young men and was tearing our nation apart. And that same grim war was straining our ties with the rest of the world.

Faith in America itself was being questioned—not only by people overseas but by Americans here at home.

Today we meet in happier circumstances. Certainly serious and complex difficulties still confront us, but there is renewed confidence in America abroad, and even more important, renewed confidence in America by Americans here at home.

This has been due importantly to one man—our President. This has been achieved by his determination and decisive leadership—his experienced handling of the staggering problems which he inherited four years ago.

Four years ago, there were 550,000 American fighting men in South Vietnam. Today there are less than 40,000.

Four years ago, inflation raged uncontrolled in an over-heated war economy. Today—with wage-price controls and rapid progress toward a peacetime economy—the rate of inflation has already been cut in half.

Four years ago, the Soviet Union and the United States appeared to be on a collision course. Today, we are working together in science, in technology, in health, in environment, in outer space exploration, and in trade.

Four years ago, there was a great wall between mainland China and America. Today, we are in productive and increasingly active communication.

Four years ago, daily shelling and raiding in the Middle East threatened another World War. Today, the U.S.-sponsored cease-fire has been in effect two years and there is hope for peace.

Four years ago, we were headed toward environmental disaster. Today, the whole nation is mobilizing to protect and restore our environment.

In each instance, the President has met these crises through decisive action. At the same time, he has also acted to meet the challenge of change. The President recognized that the patterns of the past, the concepts of the past, the establishments of the past were no longer adequate to meet the needs of today and the challenges of tomorrow. And so, four years ago, he set out to achieve fundamental changes in our concepts and relations, both internationally and here at home.

He brought new initiatives and new programs: Federal revenue sharing to strengthen state and local government services for the people; welfare reform to help those in need and protect the tax-payer; reorganization of the bureaucratic Federal grant-in-aid system to cut waste and red tape; restructuring of the Federal government to make it manageable and more responsive to human needs. Most significantly, with his deep concern for people and their changing problems, the President has completely revised our nation's priorities.

In 1968, he inherited a Federal budget which allocated 45 per cent for national defense and only 32 per cent for "human resources." Today, four years later, he has completely reversed the emphasis, with 45 per cent of the Federal budget for "human resources" and 32 per cent for national defense. And he has done this without sacrificing our national security and world leadership.

The Human Resources Budget has been doubled, providing greater support than in any previous administration to the basic areas of human concern: civil rights, equal opportunity, education, health, and the fight against drugs. In addition, there have been great increases in housing, community development, and crime control. No President or administration has done more to help meet these needs—the needs of our great cities, the needs of our suburban communities, needs which are the concern of all our people.

The President has taken bold action to achieve agreements to open up new areas of trade and to protect American workers in the face of growing foreign competition.

Together, all these far-reaching steps are bringing about a new era of peacetime prosperity:

-Witness the 2-1/2 million increase in jobs for American workers in the past 12 months alone;

-Witness the 4 per cent gain this year in real wages—increased purchasing power for American workers—the most significant gains since the runaway inflation was started seven years ago.

These accomplishments at home and the accomplishments abroad have not happened by themselves. While others talked, the President acted. While others merely wrung their hands, he had the courage and the ability to face the hard realities, to initiate new approaches, and to bring about solutions.

While others despaired:

- —He has worked to end the war in Vietnam;
- -He stood firm in the Middle East;
- -He travelled to Peking;
- -He journeyed to Moscow.

And, while others dealt in vague generalities about disarmament, he made the Strategic Arms Limitations Treaty a reality.

In short, President Nixon has brought us to the threshhold of a generation of peace—even as he works and plans for a century of peace ahead.

This is skilled management and leadership of a high order. It is this leadership and these accomplishments that bring me before you at this Convention to make a nomination.

This country and the world need the continued leadership of our President.

I say to you delegates, to you my fellow citizens of America, we need this man.

We need this man of action, this man of accomplishment, this man of experience, this man of courage. We need this man of faith in America.

It is my great honor to nominate Richard Nixon for re-election as President of the United States.





Better Future For All

This year our Republican Party has greater reason than ever before for pride in its stewardship.

When our accomplishments are weighed—when our opponents' philosophy, programs and candidates are assessed—we believe the American people will rally eagerly to the leadership which since January 1969 has brought them a better life in a better land in a safer world.

This political contest of 1972 is a singular one. No Americans before have had a clearer option. The choice is between going forward from dramatic achievements to predictable new achievements, or turning back toward a nightmarish time in which the torch of free America was virtually snuffed out in a storm of violence and protest.

It is so easy to forget how frightful it was.

There was Vietnam—so bloody, so costly, so bitterly divisive—a war in which more than a half-million of America's sons had been committed to battle—a war, it seemed, neither to be won nor lost, but only to be endlessly fought—a war emotionally so tormenting as almost to obliterate America's other worldly concerns.

And yet, as our eyes were fixed on the carnage in Asia, in Europe our alliance had weakened. The Western will was dividing and ebbing. The isolation of the People's Republic of China, with one-fourth of the world's population, went endlessly on.

At home our horrified people watched our cities burn, crime burgeon, campuses dissolve into chaos. A mishmash of social experimentalism, producing such fiscal extravaganzas as the abortive war on poverty, combined with war pressures to drive up taxes and balloon the cost of living. Working men and women found their living standards fixed or falling, the victim of inflation. Nationwide, welfare skyrocketed out of control.

The history of our country may record other crises more costly in material goods, but none so demoralizing to the American people. To millions of Americans it seemed we had lost our way.

So it was when our Republican Party came to power.

Now, four years later, a new leadership with new policies and new programs has restored reason and order

and hope. No longer buffeted by internal violence and division, we are on course in calmer seas with a sure, steady hand at the helm. A new spirit, buoyant and confident, is on the rise in our land, nourished by the changes we have made. In the past four years:

- -we have turned toward concord among all Ameri-
- -we have turned toward reason and order;
- -we have turned toward government responding sensitively and sensibly to the people's hopes and needs:
- -we have turned toward innovative solutions to the nation's most pressing problems;
- we have turned toward new paths for social progress—from welfare rolls to payrolls, from wanton pollution to vigorous environmental protection;
 we have moved far toward peace: withdrawal of our fighting men from Vietnam, constructive new relationships with the Soviet Union and the People's Republic of China, the nuclear arms race checked, the Mid-East crisis dampened, our alliances revitalized.

So once again the foreign policy of the United States is on a realistic footing, promising us a nation secure in a full generation of peace, promising the end of conscription, promising a further allocation of resources to domestic needs.

It is a saga of exhilarating progress.

We have come far in so short a time. Yet, much remains to be done.

Discontents, frustrations and concerns still stir in the minds and hearts of many of our people, especially the young. As long as America falls short of being truly peaceful, truly prosperous, truly secure, truly just for all, her task is not done.

Our encouragement is in the fact that things as they are, are far better than things that recently were. Our resolve is that things to come can be, and will be, better still.

Looking to tomorrow, to President Nixon's second term and on into the third century of this Republic, we of the Republican Party see a quarter-billion Americans peaceful and prospering as never before, humane as never before It is toward this bright tomorrow that we are determined to move, in concert with millions of discerning Democrats and concerned Independents who will not, and cannot, take part in the convulsive leftward lurch of the national Democratic Party.

The election of 1972 requires of the voters a momentous decision—one that will determine the kind of nation this is to be on its 200th birthday four years hence. In this year we must choose between strength and weakness for our country in the years to come. This year we must choose between negotiating and begging with adversary nations. This year we must choose between an expanding economy in which workers will prosper and a hand-out economy in which the idle live at ease. This year we must choose between running our own lives and letting others in a distant bureaucracy run them. This year we must choose between responsible fiscal policy and fiscal folly.

The contest is not between the two great parties Americans have known in previous years. For in this year 1972 the national Democratic Party has been seized by a radical clique which scorns our nation's past and would blight her future.

We invite our troubled friends of other political affiliations to join with us in a new coalition for progress. Together let us reject the New Left prescription for folly and build surely on the solid achievements of President Nixon's first term.

Four years ago we said, in Abraham Lincoln's words, that Americans must think anew and act anew. This we have done, under gifted leadership. The many advances already made, the shining prospects so clearly ahead, are presented in this Platform for 1972 and beyond.

May every American measure our deeds and words thoughtfully and objectively, and may our opponents' claims be equally appraised. Once this is done and judgment rendered on election day, we will confidently carry forward the task of doing for America what her people need and want and deserve.


