I wanted to share with you input staff has given in response to the question: What would be the best case scenario for your program area in three years? Here is a sampling of responses:

All programs have stable, adequate funding & ep the same staff. We have a presence in seaverton. Sufficient, accurate, complete, userfriendly data collection. Systems in place that assist us in doing our job & aren't barriers to providing services. AKD expands to Hillsboro. Head Start has a smaller waiting list, fewer kids with extensive dental needs & effective mental health services. CCR&R has a training center & total collaboration with Head Start. We are a lead agency around homeless & housing issues, homeless singles get served & homeless get into housing. 211 is operational & meeting our county's I & R needs. Energy assistance is year round, Weatherization operates at full capacity & rent assistance is adequate & stable. Opening Doors clients are served through 6 months postpartum & New Parent Network is adequately funded. Resource Development expands staffing to work with the faith community & we are local donors first choice for giving. HR & IT are adequately staffed & equipped to support agency needs. Processes are automated & streamlined. Staff are competent and responsive to each others information, documentation and communication needs. Community Action is seen as the nonprofit to work for! #### Topics - Allergies

A tea party may be the perfect prescription for annoying allergy symptoms.

A recent study revealed that a compound in green tea may help inhibit certain aspects of the immune system response that produces allergy symptoms. Whether it's grass, pollen, pet dander, mold, or dust that makes you miserable, regularly drinking green tea may help.

#### Chocolate Therapy

Tips

Warming yourself up this winter with an occasional cup of hot cocoa may be a heart-healthy habit. A recent study revealed that hot cocoa can be a rich source of flavonoids, plant compounds that have a positive impact on heart health. To make your hot chocolate heart-healthy, use a recipe that calls for dark chocolate or cocoa powder; these are rich in flavonoids. Also, keep fat and calorie counts down by making your cocoa with nonfat milk.

#### **RECIPES** – Abilgail's Buttermilk Scones

#### Mix together with a fork:

2½ cup flour 1 tsp baking powder 1/4 tsp baking soda 1/8 tsp salt ½ cup sugar

Blend in with pastry blender,

fork or fingers:

21/2 tablespoons chilled butter

Add: 1 cup buttermilk

Fold dough together to mix in all the flour. Turn onto a floured counter and knead until the dough takes on a satiny finish Roll or pat dough to about 3/4" thick. Cut in triangular sections or use a glass (dipped in flour) to cut out rounds Bake on greased cookie sheet 10 –12 minutes in a 425° oven Serve when warm with butter and jam or clotted cream and lemon curd ...or whatever your heart desires.

Reminder: If you need to choose a dentist think about Gentech. When you go to Gentech they will designate 5% of the cost of your dental work go into one of two funds for Community Action clients. You can choose for it to go into Head Start (for Head Start kids) or Housing and Homeless Services (for children and adults living in the shelter or participating in the SAFAH Self-Sufficiency program). Gentech is one of the many dentists in our communities who provide pro-bono work for many of our clients – and they have been making a big contribution to Community Action.

Sometimes you come across something that puts it all in perspective. Now that I'm maturing faster (than I want to) I am receiving annual letters from the Social Security office (like I need them to remind me how old I am!!) that tell me what my income will be when they let me retire – it also lists your annual income from the beginning of your work life. 1961 was the first year I held a 40 hr/week, 52 weeks/year job and my total income for that year was \$2,200. hhhmmmmm I was proud of each and every one of those dollars.

## SAFETY

Please remember that all staff have a responsibility to report all work injuries to their supervisor. Even if it is a paper cut! If the injury should turn into something more serious, then we will have most of the info we need to submit to the Worker's Comp insurer and be in a better position to provide support to the employee in the event they need time off from work. The failure to report injuries could lead to liabilities for the organization – failing to report the injury to the State within 5 days can also lead to liabilities for our organization.
