This week, the directors held a planning session to discuss the central administrative support needs of our programs. Central administrative support includes John's area of business and finance, as well as Winnie's area of human resources. Business and finance include office management, fiscal operations, facilities management and technology support. We have learned that when our programs grow, change, relocate, increase or decrease staff, all of our administrative support functions are impacted. We have also learned that if we don't plan for these impacts before they happen, we aren't positioned to give good support that is needed by our programs. One of the results of this planning discussion was a decision to break out the Executive Assistant position from the office management function and have that person report directly to me rather than business and finance. The duties of that position to support the Executive Director and Board of Directors have become full time, making it difficult to also manage the office operations. John will be working with his staff to reorganize the supervision of our office staff. We will keep you informed of other changes along the way.





HR (Benefits/Diversity/Q&A) Ask Winnie




In April, the Directors will begin an exciting new program/training entitled <u>Understanding Racism</u>. It is being sponsored by Tuality Healthcare and is being put on by the Understanding Racism Foundation. Some of our facilitators will be Justice Edwin Peterson, Founder and President of the foundation, and Perry Gruber, Community Affairs Mgr. with Intel Corporation. This training will involve a commitment to attend 6 weekly training meetings to explore our own conscious and unconscious perspectives on racism; examine and acknowledge our opportunities for changing and so much more! Community Action Organization is joined by participants from the Hillsboro School District, Tuality Healthcare, Intel Corp., Hillsboro Chamber of Commerce, Willamette Univ. College of Law, BCA Financial, Virginia Garcia Memorial Health Center, Garland, Griffiths, et al, Lithtex, Centro Cultural of Washington County, and the Washington County Court. We'll keep you posted.

Safety

The committee met on April 1st and it was decided to flex our meeting schedule. Like all of you, our committee members have huge amounts of work to accomplish in addition to generously working on this committee. To accommodate this, we've decided that formal meetings will be scheduled every other month. The "off month or alternate month" that a regular meeting is not scheduled, the committee will use that meeting time as a "work party" to accomplish all the tasks it has set for itself. Checks & Balances

Fiscal

Just a reminder that everyone needs to complete his or her time sheets carefully & on time – remember your paycheck is calculated from this information!

Take time to be sure all hours worked are marked; that any sick time taken is marked; and if you took vacation be sure to mark that as well.

Equally important is that you and the supervisor sign your time sheet.

If you have a new employee, contact Val to request a time sheet for that person – this insures that a time sheet is automatically produced for him/her the next pay period. (Don't dig for that ole' thing you remembered using years ago.)
