## **DIRECTOR'S COLUMN**

April is Volunteer Month! And in the spirit of volunteerism, I wanted to take a moment to thank all staff who make the time to volunteer in their communities. I know many of you volunteer at your child's school, your church or with an organization you care about. You are among the minority who is contributing your most valuable assets: your time, your talents and your expertise, to make your community a better place. Only 30% of Oregonians volunteer four or more hours a month. And we all know how precious our time is.....it's not easy to give it away!

I also want to thank staff who have "volunteered" on the job by stepping outside of their normal job duties to help make CAO a stronger organization and a good place to work. This includes staff that serves on CAO committees, such as Wellness or Safety. And staff who bring training or education sessions to the rest of us. And staff who contribute to Paycheck News, or who attend CAO events, such as Head Start graduations, CAO's Community Spirit dinner, our Shelter's birthday party, to name a few. These extra efforts build camaraderie and allow CAO to build a culture that reflects the interests and values of our employees. #### **OPEN ENROLLMENT TIME**

Each year during June, CAO negotiates health, dental, & vision insurance coverage and premium rates. During this period employees may change from one plan to another, add dependent coverage, or enroll in the plan for the first time if they have had other coverage. This year we are going to process open enrollment a bit differently. Because we think it's important for you to understand your coverage options and the costs that go with those choices, we will be presenting information at the Wellness Day event. Representatives from our insurers will be present to tell you the features & benefits of each plan, and answer your specific questions so that you can make the best choice of coverage for yourself and your family.

This month we were notified that our premium rates would increase for the 2001/2002 fiscal year, and the combined rate increases for Kaiser and Providence Good Health would amount to 20.5%. Of course, this was not acceptable and we asked other health plans to give us a quote. We talked to Regence BlueCross Blue Shield, Health Net, Life Wise, ODS, PacificSource, Pacific Care and looked at an alternative Kaiser plan. Several other companies were contacted, but they would not quote for a group less than 500 employees. The result is that after July 1, 2001 we will no longer offer the Providence Good Health plan, and, instead will offer the Pacific Care plan.

By moving to Pacific Care we will be able to limit the rate increase to 8.9% (combined), and if you have been reading the newspaper articles on health care you will know that this is very good. Another reason for choosing Pacific Care was their ability to provide most of the same doctors as Providence, enabling most of you to keep your same doctor. Pacific Care also offers access to Chiropractors, Massage Therapists, Acupuncturists, discounts with Weight Watchers, Fitness Accessories, Health Clubs, Gymboree Play & Music Programs and much more.
