The 35th anniversary of the Legislative Commission on Indian Services will be the focus of this year's Tribal Government Day, which includes participation by all nine of Oregon's federally recognized tribes.

A ceremony will start at 11 a.m. Friday in the Capitol rotunda.

A welcome will be given by Cheryle Kennedy, chairwoman of the Confederated Tribes of the Grand Ronde; Delores Pigsley, chairwoman of the Siletz Tribe, and Senate Republican Leader Ted Ferrioli, who sits on the Legislative Commission on Indian Services.

Former Gov. Vic Atiyeh, who was Senate Republican leader in 1975, will talk about the origins of the commission.

Sue Shaffer, chairwoman of the Cow Creek Band of Umpqua Indians, will talk about the commission. She is a tribal representative on the commission. Secretary of State Kate Brown will read the proclamation. Information tables by the tribes will open at 9 a.m.
