



### It's the last Page (we know you'll miss us)

#### HR (Benefits/Diversity/Q&A) Ask Winnie



Whew! This time of the year there is a lot going on. Those of you who are going on summer layoff, please note you should be receiving your COBRA Notices by the end of next week. The notice consists of a 3 page letter explaining your choices, the time frame for making them, when and where to pay premiums if you choose coverage and how much to pay. The Enrollment form should be completed & returned to HR telling us if you want to enroll or do not want to enroll. The last page is the HIPPA Notice for you to keep.

This is the time of the year when we have open enrollment for our health plans. This year there will be TWO general open enrollment periods for all staff (one in June and one in September). I will have the meeting dates confirmed and listed in the next issue. Those dates will be in June and you are encouraged to attend because the information will be important to you. An IMPORTANT piece of information to share with you will be the premium changes effective on July 1<sup>st</sup>. The September dates will be announced closer to September and also after Head Start has returned.

Since the first of the year, we have been working with the Board Personnel Committee, our Agent, and both health carriers to craft coverage that continues to sustain our excellent benefit coverage and that also allows us to cope with the amount of premium increases being proposed. Over the past 5 years (not including this July) we have experienced about a 70% increase in rates. We realize that kind of increase impacts those of you who pay some portion of your coverage as well as the Agency and it's an important cost to contain – for all of us.

# Memorial Day

Memorial Day, originally called a day to remember those who have

Decoration Day, is a day to remember those who have died in our nation's service. In 1971, it was declared a national holiday to be held on the last Monday in May.

In 1915, Moina Michael wrote:

"We cherish too, the Poppy red That grows on fields where valor led, It seems to signal to the skies That blood of heroes never dies."

She then conceived of the idea to wear red poppies on Memorial Day in honor of those who died serving the nation.

To help Americans re-educate and remind Americans of the true meaning of Memorial Day, the "National Moment of Remembrance" resolution was passed on Dec 2000 which asks that at 3 p.m. local time, for all Americans "To voluntarily and informally observe in their own way a Moment of Remembrance.

On Memorial Day, display the flag at half-staff until noon, then raise to the top of the staff.
