

Handicraft, rummage sale to benefit library

Former U.S. senator, Maurine Neuberger will select the winner of the Cedar Mill Heritage Quilt, a project by members of the Cedar Mill Community Library Assn. at 3 p.m. Saturday at the Milltown Mall in Cedar Mill.

This will be during a handicraft and art sale and display and rummage sale at the Mall which will be held Friday and Saturday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Each quilt block represents a scene from Cedar Mill history and was executed by a different person.
