


CHILD DEVELOPMENT

We have been very busy enrolling children for this school year and now we are ready to give you an update! In Part-day program we have enrolled 435 children (our numbers have been changing every hour!). Our Support Services Team called all the families, documented the phone calls, prepared children's files to go to the centers. The Referral Team has been busy with Screening Fairs and teachers have been busy scheduling Orientations and setting up the classrooms. The first day of class is Wednesday, September 18.

We have a new facility! Beaverton Child Development Center is scheduled to start serving 8 infants, 8 toddlers and 36 preschoolers as of October 1, 2002.

A Kid's Domain sites are also up and running as of September 4th at Cornelius, Echo Shaw and Harvey Clarke Elementary schools.

Trane Oregon, a local air conditioning company also joined in the day by helping hang used clothing for the store's low-income customers. The company donated a new air conditioner to Play It Again to help with the store's poor ventilation and excessive heat.

Donald Shaw, from the Weatherization program, spoke about Community Action's weatherization and refrigerator program on Tualatin Valley's cable TV September 18th in order to highlight Community Action's weatherization program. Donald, a new employee of Community Action hoped his message would reach income-qualified people who will need our services this winter.

REMINDER – (oh no! not benefits again?) Oh YeahSeptember 30th is the deadline to turn in all insurance forms for changes effective October 1, 2002. Next Open Enrollment is September 2003.

CHANGES are a'commin....The Directors have made a decision to change our work week FROM the current Saturday through Friday TO Sunday through Saturday. 
