DIRECTOR'S CORNER



Our board of directors came back together in September after a "summer break". We talked about last year's accomplishments and what's ahead for Community Action. Between 1990 and 2000 the number of Washington County residents living below 150% of poverty grew nearly 43%, from 38,113 to 60,877

ople, growing faster than the overall county population. Most of our services have grown as well, but never enough to keep pace with the need. Head Start increased from 197 to 556 kids, Energy Assistance from 2382 to 7674 households, Child Care from 39 to 155 kids and Emergency Assistance from 3100 to 7440 households, to highlight some of our growth. Overall, Community Action is experiencing a period of stability and focused, sustainable growth in spite of the general economy. We have eliminated all program deficits and created surpluses in many areas. We increased our capacity to provide greater support to programs in the areas of human resources, finance, technology, facilities and grants management. As a result, staff have been able to focus more on quality program operations and services to family and children in need. I am proud of what you have all complished and hope you are too.

Twenty-five years ago this month, in 1977, Sharon Bolmeier came to our organization as a cook at the Sunset Head Start center on Cornell Road. If Sharon is not shopping at the mall, she could be knitting, a skill she has been perfecting since she was four years old. She could also be helping her husband of 33 years. He suffered a stroke this year and she has been his major support in recovery.

Sharon was born in a small coastal town in Hawaii. She lived a block away from the beach and in her words, "... was one of the original surfer girls."

The Weatherization Program has added a new energy saving measure to our services. We test refrigerators to find out how much electricity they use and if they are big energy users, replace them with very efficient Energy Star models. In many cases these new refrigerators use one third of the energy as the old units and can create big savings.






Benefits, Diversity...

Open Enrollment meetings are important to all of us since they provide us the information we need to make decisions about our health coverage. I'm still trying to finish the set up for our new program – "Personal Choice Account" which is a way that we can pay the insurance premium with pre-tax dollars and see some savings in the process. I'm still waiting for about 30 of you who are eligible to complete your forms & return them to me so I can finish the process. A list of those folks has been sent to Directors & PAC's. If you've sent it in, you don't have to do it again – just the folks on the list.

Kaiser: I'm putting a memo into the paychecks of those people who have selected Kaiser for either medical and/or dental coverage. It explains some things you can do to when told by Kaiser that you are not in the system. Kaiser is working from their end too —with both of us working at it we can get it solved.

Bonus Recipe:

Goblin Bars

1 package brownie mix, (1 lb. 3 oz)

1 package DOVE PROMISES (Milk or Dark Chocolate)

1 package M&M's milk chocolate candies for Halloween

1 package Snickers fun size bars

- ◆ Prepare brownie mix according to manufacturer's instructions for a 8x8 inch pan Bake & let cool slightly
