Recipes

Here is a super recipe for all those zucchinis hanging around your garden.

4 medium zucchinis (about 12 inches long)
½ cup mayonnaise (can use part or all lo-fat or no-fat mayo)

2 cloves of garlic black pepper

Cut zukes in half lengthwise, then slice into 1/4-1/2 thick inch pieces.

Put in ungreased 9 x 12 baking dish.

Grate the garlic into the mayo and add lots of black pepper. (coarse grind is best)

Spoon the mayo/garlic/pepper mixture on top of the zukes and mix it in to cover them. Bake uncovered at 325 degrees for about 30-45 minutes, until the mixture bubbles and begins to brown. You will love it!

Benefits, Diversity...



As some of you know, in the past there have been problems for some Community Action employees being recognized by Kaiser as a member after you have submitted your enrollment form. I've been working with Kaiser to try and resolve the issue and have been told by Kaiser that it shouldn't happen in the future. I thought I would let you know what our process is, so you can be sure your paperwork is being processed correctly. Once you complete the forms with your personal information and enrollment selections, you send all copies of the enrollment form to HR. HR will review the form and complete the company name, policy number, effective dates, etc. At this time HR will split out the form, sending the original to the insurance company, a copy to payroll and will return a copy to you. Enrollment forms are mailed to both companies on a weekly basis. When you get your copy it is proof that your enrollment form has been sent to the insurance company. It sometimes takes the insurance company a couple of weeks to receive the form and get you entered into the system – so I recommend waiting until you have received your membership cards before you try to make an appointment with your doctor. If you have an emergency and need to see the doctor before you receive your cards, use the copy of your enrollment form that was sent back to you. Kaiser should honor that document & help you thru the emergency. If there are billing questions, we can sort it out later. If for some reason the insurance company will not accept this copy of your enrollment form, ask them to call me directly. If you don't receive your enrollment cards within 2 to 3 weeks after receiving your copy of the enrollment form – call me at ext. 257 & I'll check into it.


