Big Ed Moshofsky, Dick Ashcom, Ray Segale, and Val Culwell have shown plenty to indicate that the Oregon forward wall will be anything but weak. Vic Atiyeh, a speedy 211-pound freshman guard, is not far behind the veterans in battling for a starting position in the annual spring inter-squad game.

Corley also stressed wind sprints as a conditioning factor and a test for speed among the bulky linemen and shifty ballcarriers.
